Frequently Asked Questions

Q Why is the Therapeutic Riding program effective?

A Our therapeutic riding clients are focused on improving physical, cognitive and behavioral abilities through horse riding lessons. Each lesson is tailored to meet the individual needs of each client and focuses on helping the individual achieve their specific goals.

Q How is the Equine Assisted Mental Health program different from Therapeutic Riding program?

A Horses are extremely sensitive to their environment and are known to mirror the moods and emotions of those around them, which creates a keen awareness and a deeper level of connection for our clients. Our Mental Health program works with clients in ground-based interaction with horses to facilitate the therapeutic process. In each session the horse becomes the focal point and clients are able to understand the impact of their behavior by watching how the horse behaves. This mirrored behavior allows each client to analyze their situation and unlock the solutions to overcome their personal challenges.

While different in their approach, the common thread is the horse. Both programs allow participants to have a customized program and ownership to improve their skills and to achieve their individual goals.

Q Why did Inspiration Ranch leave Panther Creek?

A After a diligent two-year search and a great deal of prayer and thoughtful consideration, the Inspiration Ranch Board and leadership determined that we needed to find a new home. Our programs have reached their capacity, and we are unable to accommodate new clients or horses based on our limited acreage. In addition to growth challenges, our home in The Woodlands sustained three devastating floods since 2016. White Bridge Farm also offers ample space that is properly configured for our programs, which will allow our programs to grow.

Q Why did you select White Bridge Farm?

A The White Bridge property is an incredible oasis that will support our mission and daily work, including:

- **Increased Acreage:** With 40 acres of land we will be able to grow both of our programs by adding horses to our herd, reducing our wait list, and growing our Therapeutic Riding and Mental Health programs to serve the needs of Montgomery County.

- **Existing Facilities:** Our work requires a unique infrastructure that includes barns, fenced paddocks, and administrative space, and this combination is a rare find. Smart renovation of existing facilities is allowing Inspiration Ranch to quickly transition to our new property. We plan to be up and running by the end of summer 2019!

- **Elevation:** White Bridge is at one of the highest points in Montgomery County! Staff will no longer have to worry about flooding and evacuating our horses and instead their sole focus can return to supporting our clients as they work to reach their individual goals and milestones.

Q Will children still be on the wait list?

A We are currently working to add additional staff and horses so that we can significantly reduce the 53 children on our wait list once we settle into the new property. The goal would be to cut the wait list by half by the end of 2019. In order to best maximize our existing staff and to reduce any strain increased enrollment may have on our beloved horses, we plan to grow our program's capacity by adding horses to the herd and staff and volunteers to our team. In order to execute this most responsibly, we will take a slow and deliberate approach, fully evaluating every change to ensure it is best for our clients, staff, volunteers and horses.

Q How will this new property support Inspiration Ranch's mission and vision?

A The new property will allow us to expand current services as well as grow new programs that will provide additional resources for our families without the frequent interruption of the floods and evacuations.

Q Will the move temporarily impact your programs?

A No. Inspiration Ranch is still serving our clients and their families through our therapeutic riding and Mental Health programs at our Woodlands location. Our staff has developed a highly customized plan to ensure as much continuity as possible for our clients during the move.

Q What can we expect over the next six months?

A We are thrilled that renovations are already well underway. During this transition, we will continue to operate both of our programs at our location in The Woodlands. We anticipate moving to our new home in late summer 2019 and will communicate clearly with all of our clients and supporters when we have more specific information about opening day at our new property. During the construction phase we will be moving the existing covered arena to the new location, adding an additional arena for the Mental Health program, renovating the existing facilities to include wheelchair ramps, ADA bathrooms, a Family Center, Welcome Center with a Resource Library, classroom and meeting space, and a new Tack Room that includes a classroom for rainy days!

Q How do you plan to raise money for this new property?

A Inspiration Ranch's leadership has developed a detailed financial plan and recently approved a \$4M campaign to support the construction and renovations of Inspiration Ranch's new location.
